Travel & Parking Workshops March 2007 Engineers and Planners Register Now

Register now for these one-day workshops presented by NZ Trips and Parking Database Bureau (NZTPDB) and arranged jointly on behalf of IPENZ, NZPI, LGNZ, the University of Auckland, the University of Canterbury and Ministry for the Environment.

The workshops are for Engineers and Planners who are directly involved in both policy and operational aspects of travel, trips and parking. It has direct application to Transport Assessments, Transport Strategies, District Plans and development proposals. It is also suitable as an introduction for students and new staff.

The purpose of this one-day workshop is to:

1. Provide practitioners with theory and practical tools in respect of trip generation and parking demand.
2. Discover the information required in site surveys and the usefulness of the national NZTPDB database.
3. Explore the standards and conditions for engineering design standards and District Plan rules.
4. Assist integration of RMA and travel planning outcomes, reporting, evidence and client needs.
5. Discuss monitoring and future needs including the development of the NZTPDB database.

The workshops are approved and linked to the IPENZ Competence Standards and the NZPI Guidelines for Professional Development. The workshops are convened by NZTPDB, the logistics, venues and registrations are arranged by IPENZ. The two main presenters are assisted by 4 or 5 local facilitators who will lead the workshops.

Facilitators

The facilitators are all active in the engineering and planning professions in each region and are members of NZTPDB. They will introduce themselves to the workshop participants with a brief example of an

interesting trip generation and parking study related to land use which they have personally surveyed and reported in the recent past. They are drawn from councils, consultancies and Transit, where the skills and reporting are within the context of good practice and the policies of sustainable road management and District Plans are 'normal business'.

Christchurch, he has been professionally and actively associated with transportation planning, traffic engineering and town planning, over a long career in local government as both an officer and a consultant. He was the author of both the Trips and Parking Research Reports 1972 (NRB /RRU Research Bulletin No 15), and also the review report in 2001 (Transfund Report No 209). His work has covered a wide range of Regional and District Planning and also extensive comprehensive Transportation Planning. Since NZTPDB was formed in 2002 he has been its Contract Administrator.

Steve Abley BE(Hons), NZCE, MIPENZ, CPEng, MICE, CEng(UK). Consultant Chartered Professional Engineer practicing in Christchurch. Steve has had 17 years of professional engineering experience including four years of traffic engineering experience in the United Kingdom. He is a specialist transportation and traffic engineer and has a practice including investigations, reporting, advising councils and other clients and evidence before the Environment Court. Steve has a special interest in 'living streets' and pedestrian strategies. He specialises in travel and transportation assessments related to developments and consent proposals and is contracted as Chief Researcher to NZTPDB.
